In late March, seven community leaders from Alberta participated in Burning Man's Global Leader Conference in San Francisco. On May 1st a group of LEA members vanquished MOOP during the annual river clean-up in Calgary. Later that month, we held our AGM and elected a new Board for 2016/17. Then the LEA released a new Freezer Burn Code of Conduct. This was followed shortly by the main event, Freezer Burn, our 9th annual Regional Burn. The LEA was awarded a grant through Calgary Arts Development so that we can support more community art over the next two years. # **Global Leadership Conference 2016**

### **Initiative: Freezer Burn 2016**

The LEA's biggest Initiative, Freezer Burn 2016: Myths & Legends, happened during the solstice weekend June 17-20, 2016. Freezer Burn 2016: Myths & Legends was a great success. We had a beautiful temple and an epic effigy; both had stunning burns. Freezer Burn participants brought their inspired art to the Fraya (we awarded 35 art grants totaling \$19,284.34!). There were more participants, theme camps and volunteers this year. Our team of volunteers (all 327 of them) worked tirelessly to breathe life into our 9th annual Regional Burn. The LEA would like to especially thank the 2016 Producers, Partytime, Spacey, Nadz and London, who truly embody the spirit of doers within our community.

#### **LEA Art Grants**

The League of Extraordinary Albertans applied for and was awarded an Organization Opportunity Grant from Calgary Arts Development. This means that we have additional monies over the next two years to support community art projects! In the past quarter, the LEA supported these three art projects that were displayed at Freezer Burn 2016:

## The Bologna Pony

An educational interactive art installation that is best described as a human powered mechanical bull...except instead of a bull it was a giant phallus that participants rode. This piece debuted at Freezer Burn 2016. Not only did it teach participants about safe sex by having the option to wear safety equipment, but also in consent awareness. They had a sign indicating the rules of use and invited users to gain consent with a Magic Eight Ball when the art project was unmanned. They also held a tournament on Sunday that awarded the first annual Bologna Pony trophy.

This year they added fire lamps to enhance the Apothecary's visibility at night so that they could serve more hot beverages at Freezer Burn 2016 and beyond.

#### **BLASTO**

BLASTO is a ray gun blaster shooting range, operating on eyesafe infrared light, wifi protocol with LED targets and flame effects. Participants used an electronics outfitted airsoft gun to BLASTO targets at Freezer Burn 2016.
